The meeting was chaired by Vice-rector Annelin Eriksen, who also has represented the UiB leadership in the Hub's Steering group (as an observer).

### Item 2/2020 - Hub activities 2019 and plans for 2020

Views/points raised during the discussion:

- The ecosystems of AE's Hubs can be utilized better when relevant both in cooperation and flow of information.
- Visibility is important Eystein's lecture at the University of Gotheburg in Sweden was a good example and could be followed up by similar events/lectures in the Hub's region.
- The plan is to follow up the <u>Changing Arctic event</u> in Estonia with a new conference in the autumn of 2021.
- The UN IPCC Working Group I contribution to the Sixth Assessment Report (released August 9<sup>th</sup> 2021) (up-to-date physical understanding of the climate system and climate change, bringing together the latest advances in climate science, and combining multiple lines of evidence from paleoclimate, observations, process understanding, and global and regional climate simulations). This report might create good opportunities for events but must be coordinated with other Norwegian actors perhaps better as a pan-Nordic event, perhaps this autumn (Erlend and Eystein will discuss).
- The <u>IEA Global Energy Review 2021</u> has created a lot of debate the Hub might draw attention to the practical uptake.
- Martin Fernø is planning an exhibition in the University Museum in Bergen on CO2 storage will include a series of events (perhaps with pan-Nordic perspectives included).

## Item 3/2020 - Strategy Document Draft

Views/points raised during the discussion:

- National scientific advice mechanisms are very important Finland's new mechanism is almost in place and could be a theme for an event important to eliminate conflict of interests, so national mechanisms should not be executed by governments.
- Nomination of new AE members is important there are no limits of the numbers of scientists that can be nominated.
- Science for policy is a very important aspect of the strategic plan.
- Be aware that the "hard sciences" are not very visible in the plan but many Swedish members are from these areas.
- It is a challenge for many of the Hubs, not only AE-Bergen, to engage their extended region, e.g., Barcelona for the Mediterranean region.
